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I. SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

The 221st Aviation Company (Surveillance Airplane Light) was activated at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, on 24 March 1965 per TOE 1-7D with change 6. Major Donald Modica [592], Armor assumed command on 15 May 1965. The unit had readiness dates of 3 June 1965 for equipment, 16 June 1965 for aircraft, and 8 July 1965 for personnel. At the time of departure from Fort Bragg, on 11 July 1965, there were 100% officers, 100% Warrant Officers, and 57% enlisted men present for duty. The company was air transported by Military Air Transport Service (MATS) from Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina, to Saigon, Vietnam.

Upon arrival at Saigon, on 14-15 July 1965, the unit lost one platoon to the 219th Aviation (SAL) and in turn picked up one platoon of the 74th Aviation Company (SAL). On 16 July 1965 the unit deployed to its base airfield, Soc Trang. The units plan for support of the IV Corps surveillance program was to support each of the three Divisions with a platoon, and provide support for Special Forces of IV Headquarters with the remaining platoon. Based on this plan, three platoons moved out on 23 July to start training in their respective division areas with the aviators of the former 4th platoon, 74th Aviation Company (SAL). The aircraft used for the check out period were six (6) aircraft laterally transferred from the 74th Airplane Company (SAL) plus nine (9) aircraft assigned to the air mobile companies of the 13th Combat Aviation Battalion. Check outs were completed and aviators incorporated into the aviation support plan by 27 July 1965. On 1 August 1965, the unit received five (5) from the assembly point in Saigon. The unit operated with eleven (11) assigned and nine (9) attached aircraft until 15 August 1965, when it began receiving two (2) to four (4) aircraft per day, reaching an authorized strength of 32 aircraft on 27 August 1965. The unit equipment arrived in Saigon on 23 July 1965 and at Soc Trang on 11 August 1965, in excellent condition. Deployment to sectors began on 3 August 1965 and was completed on 27 August 1965. During the period 21 July 1965 to 31 August 1965 the unit flew 2491 hours in support of the IV Corps. On 1 September 1965 the 221st Aviation Company (SAL) was declared operational. From 21 July 1965 to 31 December 1965 the company flew 14,195 sorties and a total of 14,224 hours. The average aircraft availability for the same period was 84%. Hits were received on an average of 1 per 710 sorties. The aircraft accident rate as of 31 December 1965 was 7.0 (computed on 14,224 hours). The only accident occurred on 8 September 1965, since which the unit has flown 10,442 accident free hours.

II. MISSION, ORGANIZATION, ACTIVATION, TRAINING, AND MOVEMENT OVERSEAS

Mission: To provide an integrated and coordinated aerial surveillance program and reconnaissance effort throughout the IV Corps Tactical area.

Organization: The company was organized under TOE 1-7D with Change 6 (Annex A). The total authorized strength is one hundred and fifty six (156) men; forty one (41) officers, one (1) warrant officer, and one hundred and fourteen (114) enlisted men. The company's sub-elements consist of: Headquarters and Headquarters Platoon, four (4) Aerial Surveillance Platoons, and a Service Platoon. The company's aircraft consisted of thirty two (32) O-1D "Bird Dogs", eight (8) per Aerial Surveillance Platoon. The total number of aircraft per platoon was then adjusted based on mission and need.

Activation: The 221st Aviation Company (SAL) was activated on 24 March 1965 under General Order 53, Headquarters, Third United States Army, Ft. McPherson Georgia, by authority of messages DA 707331, 16 March 1965 and ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ DA 404145, US CONARC, 23 March 1965. The same general order also directed the place of activation at Fort Bragg, North Carolina and attached the unit to the XVIII Airborne Corps. The unit was further attached to the 5th Logistical Command and in turn to the 55th Medical Group and finally to the 45th Air Ambulance Company, which acted as host unit. Property Book 221 was opened and requisitions were prepared and submitted by the 45th Air Ambulance Company supply personnel for all TOE items. Enlisted records were screened at XVIII Airborne Corps for personnel available to fill MOS's locally. Officer requirements were met at Department of the Army level. On 9 April 1965, Major Donald Modica [592], designated Commanding Officer made a liaison visit to Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and was briefed by the 5th Logistical Command Project Officer. On 24 April 1965, forty-four (44) enlisted personnel were transferred from units at Fort Bragg and opened the unit area assigned to the 221st Aviation Company (SAL) in preparation for the arrival of the remainder of personnel. On 14 and 15 May 1965, forty-one (41) Officers and one (1) Warrant Officer arrived at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

Training: Unit aviators underwent an extensive training program aimed at the type missions that the unit would be required to perform in Vietnam. All personnel were screened for ~~XXXXXX~~ and a training program was initiated to meet those requirements. The following subjects were thoroughly covered: Personal Affairs, Customs of Southeast Asia, Area Operations, Geneva Convention, Code of Conduct, Escape and Evasion, Survival, Emergency First Aid, Psychological Operations, Aviation Safety, Aerial Artillery Adjustment, Aerial Photography, and Flares. All personnel were CBR qualified, and qualified with their individual weapons. During the period 15 May 1965 to 10 July 1965 the unit aviators flew a total of 212 hours on installation aircraft to complete annual minimums: 68.10 hours night, 85.10 instrument, 58.80 cross country. In addition 152 hours were flown for pay purposes and 484 hours flown to support training and station missions, therefore, 848 hours total were flown to Fort Bragg by the aviators of the 221st Avn. Co. Training of newly assigned aviators in Vietnam consisted of a IV Corps orientation, by unit instructor pilots, prior to being assigned to a platoon and a detailed division and sector check out after assignment. Therefore, ninety (90) day standardization rides are given to all unit aviators.

Movement Overseas: On 8 Jun 1965, the equipment readiness date, the unit shipped its vehicles and sixteen (16) CONEX containers of general cargo to the Mobile ~~XXXXXXXX~~. Outstanding requisitions were reported for ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ destination. On 2 July ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ consisting of one (1) Officer, one (1) Warrant Officer, and three (3) Enlisted men departed Fayetteville, North Carolina via commercial air for Saigon, Vietnam. On 10 July 1965 the unit was notified that it would begin movement on 11 July 1965 via three (3) C-130 aircraft from Pope AFB, North Carolina. The first aircraft departed at 1300 hours on 11 July 1965 with twenty (20) officers, thirty (30) enlisted men, and 3,000 pounds of equipment. The second aircraft departed 2000 hours on 11 July 1965 with two (2) officers, nine (9) enlisted men, and 10,000 pounds of equipment. The last aircraft departed at 2250 hours, 12 July 1965 with nineteen (19) officers, thirty one (31) enlisted men, and 3,000 pounds of equipment. The additional men; one (1) officer, and seven (7) enlisted men, were members of the 325th Signal Detachment (Avionics), who moved with the 221st Aviation Company (SAL). Unit strength at the time of the movement was: Officers 100%, Warrant Officers 100%, and Enlisted men 57% The unit arrived at Saigon on 14-16 July 1965 and on its base airfield, Soc Trang, on 16 July 1965.

III. DEPLOYMENT AND EMPLOYMENT

The units plan for support of the IV Corps Surveillance Plan to support each of three (3) divisions with one (1) platoon and provide support for the Special Forces and IV Corps Headquarters with the remaining platoon. On 1 August 1965 the unit received its first five (5) aircraft from the assembly point at Saigon. From 15 August 1965 to 27 August 1965 the unit received from two (2) to four (4) aircraft per day, until it received its authorized strength of thirty two (32) aircraft. Unit equipment arrived in Saigon on 23 July 1965 and at Soc Trang on 11 August 1965. The equipment was in excellent condition with minor exceptions. The vehicles were all slightly damaged, but serviceable. Deployment to sectors began on 3 August 1965 and was completed on 27 August 1965 with the exception of those sector airfields still undergoing improvements. The company was deployed as follows:

The remaining four (4) aircraft support the 221st Aviation Company Headquarters and are used extensively as float aircraft.

IV. COMBAT OPERATIONS

The basic unit of operation was located at sector or province level. Here the assigned intelligence officer was responsible for assigning missions, targeting, briefing and debriefing the aviator and observer and forwarding reports to higher headquarters. At this level, repeated systematic coverage of the same area by the same aviator observer team resulted in complete familiarity with activity patterns in the area and made abnormalities immediately noticeable.

At division level, the primary utilization of aircraft was in support of combat operations, performing such missions as convoy escort, radio relay, artillery adjustment, and combat observation. Additional support was rendered to the sectors as well as conducting limited division surveillance. At times division utilized sector aircraft in support of division operations within that specific sector.

Corps aircraft were used primarily for radio relay between headquarters during division operations, adjustment of corps artillery, and naval gunfire. Special Forces aircraft provided border surveillance for remote outposts as well as combat observation in support of their operations.

The following type tasks/missions have been flown by the 221st Aviation Company (SAL): Airborne Command Post, artillery adjustment, to include naval gunfire, convoy escort, forward air control, tactical aeromedical evacuation, radio relay, airborne resupply, airlanded resupply, flare drop, combat support liaison, psychological warfare, search and rescue, combat observation, and visual reconnaissance.

Approximately fifty percent (50%) of all the missions; hours and sorties flown during the period August 1965 thru December 1965 were devoted to combat observation and visual reconnaissance, twenty percent (20%) to radio relay, five percent (5%) to convoy escort, with the remainder of the various missions being about equally divided, each being a small percentage of the whole.

The 221st Aviation Company (SAL) through the Corps, Division, and Sector aviators, supported every division operation, numerous regimental and smaller unit operations conducted in the IV Corps area.

V. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

On 24 April 1965, the company's first personnel, forty-four (44) Enlisted men were transferred from other units at Fort Bragg, North Carolina to the 221st Aviation Company (SAL). On 14 and 15 May 1965, forty-one (41) officers and one (1) Warrant Officer arrived and signed in with the unit. Individual personnel records were screened and the assigned officers and enlisted men were organized into platoons and sections. Simultaneously with the processing and preparation of the units supplies and equipment for shipment, a POR schedule was set up. Unit personnel were checked for ID cards and dog tags and received their physicals, Central checks, and required immunizations. Personnel also underwent the required POR training, weapons, and CBR qualification.

Rosters of personnel initially assigned to the company, personnel losses and gains as well as a roster of promotions from 25 April 1965 to 31 December 1965 are included in Annex C, D, E, and F.

The morale of company personnel was high at all times, with an attitude of "Lets' get on with it" prevailing.

Disciplinary problems were few. Eight (8) Article 15's were administered, the first on 7 June 1965, and the last on 11 December 1965. There were no disciplinary problems among the officer ranks.

Immunization requirements were given emphasis through all levels of the chain of command. A monthly roster was prepared by the company headquarters and disseminated to the platoons listing the immunization requirements for the given month. Each platoon submitted a report at the last of the month when the immunization has been completed. No individual in the company contracted a disease for which there was a required immunization

A leave and R and R policy was developed in accordance with existing regulations and directives whereby each individual was entitled to two (2) seven (7) day leaves and one (1) out of country R and R for a period of from five (5) to seven (7) days. Numerous in country R and R's were granted in the form of three (3) day passes or VOCO's. Out of country leave and R and R areas included Bangkok, Hong Kong, Manila, Taiwan, and Japan. In country R and R's and VOCO's were taken in Saigon or Vung Tau.

The company has earned three hundred and eleven (311) Air Medals through 31 December 1965. In addition several awards of the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry have been earned by unit personnel. The Purple Heart was awarded to the following members of the company for wounds sustained on 22 November 1965 at Soc Trang: SFC Gust Callivas [124] (Posthumous), Sp5 Alfred D. Flick 280], Sp5 Robert A. Watson [919], Sp4 Cleveland J. Alleman [009] and SP4 David H. Cook 175]. Three recommendations for the Distinguished Flying Cross are pending.

The unit crest was designed by Capt. Littlewood [517], a drawing and explanation of the symbols is included as Annex G. The crest was made in pocket patch form by N. S. Mayer of New York and is worn on the right breast pocket of the fatigue uniform.

The 221st Aviation Company (SAL) also supported local civic activities. During the month of December 1965, unit personnel donated money and presented something to the Soc Trang Orphanage. Lt. Paul Kish [973] stationed at Bac Lieu, took it upon himself to initiate a clothing drive in his home town, Bangor, Maine, which netted several thousand pounds of clothing and soap for the Bac Lieu Orphanage.

The company underwent an Inspector General's inspection on 15 December 1965 and received a superior rating in all areas.

VI. MAINTENANCE AND LOGISTICS

During the month of August 1965 the company received twenty-six (26) aircraft from the 611th Transportation Company (Direct Support) and six (6) aircraft by transfer from the 74th Aviation Company (SAL). Initially the company had nine (9) additional aircraft on hand receipt from the 611th Transportation Company (DS). These ships were utilized as float air October – December 1965. During the month of December 1965 the unit received a U-6A from the 121st Aviation Company to serve as a support aircraft.

A system for accomplishing scheduled maintenance was devised whereby the assigned maintenance personnel were divided into four (4) PE crews, an engine crew, and airfield service section. Furthermore, a monthly maintenance forecast was programmed by the maintenance officer to ensure a steady flow of aircraft through required inspections, while still allowing sufficient personnel to accomplish nonscheduled maintenance and repair combat damage. Platoon aircraft assigned in support of sectors were given a specific date to arrive at Soc Trang for scheduled maintenance. Other aircraft were assigned open dates, allocated to the platoon on the basis of two (2) dates per aircraft.

In August 1965, the unit's tech supply section initiated four hundred and four (404) requisitions. Of these the majority were priority twelve (12) for stockage of the prescribed load list (PLL). In September 1965 the unit placed the first EDP requisitions, twenty-two (22) in all as an additional four hundred and forty five (445) requisitions. October 1965 saw the first revision of the PLL with the addition of twenty-three (23) line items, making a total of two hundred and sixty (260) items. In addition the unit maintained an additional one hundred and seventy-four (174) line items in fringe stock. In November 1965, thirty-eight (38) EDP requisitions were submitted out of a total of two hundred and sixty-one (261). Fifteen percent (15%) of all the requisitions for that month were EDP category and sixty-four percent (64%) were rush requisitions. December 1965 was one of the lowest months for EDP requisitions and the unit lost only three percent (3%) availability due to EDP.

On 22 November 1965, aircraft number 55-4700, damaged during a Viet Cong 75mm attack on Soc Trang, was declared a total loss. It was the only aircraft lost due to combat damage.

The maintenance platoon took as its motto. "We have done so much with so little, its now our accepted way." Due to shipping difficulties the company never received any of its special equipment or shop sets. The aircraft were maintained utilizing mechanics tool sets and equipment borrowed from the 80th and 167th Transportation Detachments (DS).
